Clef Studies - Vladislav Blazhevich 1999-10-01

Material contained in this book will not only enable trombonists to acquaint them with the basic functions of reading the alto, tenor and bass clefs, but will also afford the opportunity to practice: Legato slurring, mixed meters, odd meters, sequential exercises, scale and arpeggio patterns, F attachment exercises. The realization of a true legato style is one of the trombonist's most cherished dreams; to further

the student's progress in developing such a legato technique, the editor has cast many of the exercises formerly set in a straight forte tonguing style into an expressive legato setting. Thus, while the student is mastering the problems of changing clefs he/she may also be applying the soft tongue (dah) legato approach to the musical examples contained herein.

The Art of Trombone Playing - Edward Kleinhammer 1999-10-19
Edward Kleinhammer, author of *The Art of Trombone Playing*, joined the Civic Orchestra, the training orchestra for the Chicago Symphony, in 1940. After two years he was accepted by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, where he remained for his entire career until he retired in 1985. He has played under every Chicago Symphony Orchestra conductor, covering from Frederick Stock to Sir Georg Solti. In 1986 he received the Distinguished Service Award from the International Trombone Association. While Kleinhammer states that his book "is written for the student who has no teacher available or for the teacher seeking more fundamental knowledge of the field of trombone playing," he emphasizes that it is also "for the trombonist (in any stage of proficiency) who is always a student."

Guide To Teaching Brass - Dan Bachelder 2002

The Art of French Horn Playing - Philip Farkas 1999-10-19

In 1956, when Summy-Birchard published Farkas's book, he was a solo horn player for the Chicago Symphony and had held similar positions with other orchestras, including the Boston Symphony, Cleveland Orchestra, and Kansas City Conservatory, DePaul University, Northwestern University, and Roosevelt University in Chicago. *The Art of French Horn Playing* set the pattern, and other books in the series soon followed, offering help to students in learning to master their instruments and achieve their goals.

Lip Slur Melodies - Brad Edwards 2013-06-23

This book has over 100 etudes and 33 duets relying exclusively on the natural slurs of a trombone. They are designed for the common F-attachment tenor trombone although one section is meant exclusively for the double-valve bass trombone. They progress from easy to quite challenging.

Trombone Craft - Brad Edwards 2012-05

Trombone Craft is a progressive method method targeted to high school or college trombone students. It can be useful for professionals as well. The first half of the book is in three main parts covering a variety of technical and rhythmic challenges. The second half of the book contains 8 appendices covering such topics as multiple tonguing, scales, high range development and tone/tuning.

The many errors that exist in the old trombone edition are now corrected in this new book. The Bordogni Vocalises (or Melodious Études) are essential for all tubists. For many years tubists were required to transpose the Bordogni Vocalises (Melodious Études) down

one octave from the trombone edition. Ideally-and especially when playing the high tuba-the music should be played "at pitch" as it appears on the page. Many younger tubists did not know how to transpose, and many advanced players did not use the Vocalises on instruments in higher keys. Therefore, much of the benefit of Bordogni's works remained untapped.

Daily Studies for All Saxophones - Trent Kynaston 1999-10-07
