Proof Rolling of Foundation Soil and Prepared Subgrade During Construction - Phillip Dunston

16. Abstract Proof rolling provides a method to examine the entire subgrade surface as a compliment to standard random acceptance testing. Proof rolling requires established criteria that account for the interplay of equipment parameters and soil characteristics, technique, and other specifics of the project to allow for proper interpretation. The researchers concluded that proof rolling is not appropriate for determining soil elastic properties, while it can reveal in situ strength properties. No information from state highway agencies (SHA) publications or interviews reports using proof rolling other than for the evaluation of the subgrade. Only eight SHA's have notable specifications or other supporting documents containing significant guidance or criteria. The requirements provided for use of either of two equipment types—tandem-axle rear dump trucks and chariot-style rollers—and a range of evaluation criteria based on soil type and whether the project is new construction or re-construction. Recommendations provided fall

within parameters practiced by states that have the most well-developed specifications and practices for proof rolling. The recommendations include: evaluation is of the subgrade only and the equipment shall be either a tandem-axle rear dump truck or a tri-axle rear dump truck (with raised third axle) loaded to a minimum gross weight of 20 tons. The chariot-style roller loaded to a minimum gross weight of 40 tons could be alternatively specified. The test shall be a single pass in each traffic lane with the passing criteria of a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ deflection for new construction and 1/2 $\frac{1}{2}$ deflection for re-constructed or stabilized subgrade, as well as the absence of pumping and cracking.

Ideologies in Action - Alexandra Jaffe 2013-07-31

In Corsica, spelling contests, road signs, bilingual education bills and Corsican language newscasts leave language planners and ordinary speakers deeply divided over how to define what "counts" as Corsican and how it is connected with cultural identity. In *Ideologies in Action* Alexandra Jaffe explores the complex interrelationship between linguistic ideologies and practices on the French island of Corsica. This detailed exploration of the ideological and political underpinnings of three decades of language planning raises fundamental questions about what it means to "save" a minority language, and the way in which specific cultural, political and ideological contexts shape the "successes" and "failures" of linguistic engineering efforts. Jaffe's ethnography focuses both on the way dominant language ideologies are inscribed in the everyday experience of ordinary people, as well as how they shape the evolving strategies of language planners trying to revitalize the Corsican language. While Jaffe's analysis demonstrates the pervasive influence of dominant language ideologies on minority language speakers and language planners, she also draws on case studies from everyday discourse, educational practice and public and mediatized debates over language issues to develop an ethnographically-grounded perspective on levels of resistance. In the final part of the book she explores the emergence (and the limits) of "radical" genres of resistance found in forms of Corsican language activism and in examples of codeswitching and language mixing in bilingual radio practice. This book

contributes to a growing literature on language ideology, and will be of interest to anthropologists, political scientists and linguists interested in the practical and theoretical dimensions of language contact, minority language literacy, bilingual education, and language shift.

A section on obstacles to implementing active learning techniques leads naturally to the final section, "Conclusions and Recommendations," which outlines the roles that each group within the university can play in order to encourage the implementation of active learning strategies. Securities and Futures - United States. General Accounting Office 1986

Pursuant to a congressional request, GAO

studied the securities industry oversight process, focusing on: (1) the history of securities and futures trading; (2) the detailed operations of the securities and futures markets; and (3) the self-regulatory organizations that govern the two markets. GAO noted that: (1) competitive changes in the securities and futures exchange industries have resulted from changes in inflation and interest rates, technological advances in information and communications, changes in the federal regulatory climate, and increased overlap of securities and futures products; (2) the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC) have primary federal responsibility for regulating the securities and futures markets, respectively; and (3) the evolution of the financial markets has given rise to fears that new and unacceptable risks may accompany competitive changes. GAO also noted that: (1) securities markets began to develop very early in the nation's history, but Congress did not establish a federal role in securities regulation until 1933, when it enacted the Securities Exchange Act; (2) since 1933, Congress has gradually expanded SEC authority and responsibilities; and (3) self-regulatory organizations, such as the stock exchanges and the National Association of Securities Dealers, engage in many regulatory activities under SEC oversight. In addition, GAO noted that: (1) commodity futures contracts stabilize commodity prices and offer farmers and investors the opportunity to better manage financial risks; (2) self-regulatory organizations perform most regulatory functions in the futures markets, under CFTC supervision; and (3) both SEC and CFTC monitor self-regulatory organizations under their jurisdiction using market analysis techniques to identify various possibly illegal transactions.

What does it mean to be a citizen? What impact does an active democracy have on its citizenry and why does it fail or succeed in fulfilling its promises? Most modern democracies seem unable to deliver the goods that citizens expect; many politicians seem to have given up on representing the wants and needs of those who elected them and are keener on representing

themselves and their financial backers. What will it take to bring democracy back to its original promise of rule by the people? Bernd Reiter's timely analysis reaches back to ancient Greece and the Roman Republic in search of answers. It examines the European medieval city republics, revolutionary France, and contemporary Brazil, Portugal, and Colombia. Through an innovative exploration of country cases, this study demonstrates that those who stand to lose something from true democracy tend to oppose it, making the genealogy of citizenship concurrent with that of exclusion. More often than not, exclusion leads to racialization, stigmatizing the excluded to justify their non-membership. Each case allows for different insights into the process of how citizenship is upheld and challenged. Together, the cases reveal how exclusive rights are constituted by contrasting members to non-members who in that very process become racialized others. The book provides an opportunity to understand the dynamics that weaken democracy so that they can be successfully addressed and overcome in the future.

Today, close to half of the Brazilian youth aged 15-29 years old is not fully economically engaged, because they are neither working nor studying, are studying in schools of poor quality, or are working in informal and precarious jobs. The report shows how the youth prospects in the labor market are dimmed by policies favoring existing workers over new entrants; in addition, it shows how youth are often ill equipped to meet an increasingly challenging labor market.
