Horror films can be bloody, gory, and disturbing, so some people argue that they have bad moral effects, inciting viewers to imitate cinematic violence or desensitizing them to atrocities. In *The Naked and the Undead: Evil and the Appeal of Horror*, Cynthia A. Freeland seeks to counter both aesthetic disdain and moral condemnation by focusing on a select body of important and revealing films, demonstrating how the genre is capable of deep philosophical reflection about the existence and nature of evil?both human and cosmic. In exploring these films, the author argues against a purely psychoanalytic approach and opts for both feminist and philosophical understandings. She looks at what it is in these movies that serves to elicit specific reactions in viewers and why such responses as fear and disgust are ultimately pleasurable. The author is particularly interested in showing how gender figures into

screen presentations of evil. The book is divided into three sections: Mad Scientists and Monstrous Mothers, which looks into the implications of male, rationalistic, scientific technology gone awry; The Vampire's Seduction, which explores the attraction of evil and the human ability (or inability) to distinguish active from passive, subject from object, and virtue from vice; and Sublime Spectacles of Disaster, which examines the human fascination with horror spectacle. This section concludes with a chapter on graphic horror films like The Texas Chainsaw Massacre. Written for both students and film enthusiasts, the book examines a wide array of films including: The Silence of the Lambs, Repulsion, Frankenstein, The Fly, Dead Ringers, Alien, Bram Stoker's Dracula, Interview with the Vampire, Frenzy, The Shining, Eraserhead, Hellraiser, and many others.

En La condición anárquica Lordon analiza y desmonta la teoría del valor, más allá del campo económico, para desplegar los numerosos enfoques de los que fue objeto dicha teoría por parte de sistemas y corrientes de pensamiento a lo largo de la historia. Es decir: la condición anárquica desborda la razón o la vuelve inaprensible, sin llegar a suprimirla. Las razones axiológicas le permiten al autor tomar el marxismo, entre otras herramienta de análisis. "La condición anárquica -dice Lordon- es un mundo de fluctuación indefinida que sólo se estabiliza temporariamente bajo la cláusula de mantener a raya la percepción del vacío". Respecto del valor económico, "no menos vacío que los otros", el autor cuestiona que se mantenga ajeno a los demás valores: a los sociales, o a los del derecho, a los de la moral, a

los de las creencias religiosas o a los de las prácticas estéticas. Bajo el neologismo de axiomaquia, definido como una lucha exacerbada por los valores, Lordon plantea las disputas desatadas en distintos sectores sociales por conquistar la hegemonía y el reconocimiento a través de luchas por la validación colectiva de proposiciones privadas en diversos planos como, por ejemplo, las redes sociales, en las que imperan virulentos enfrentamientos a los fines de existir socialmente. Power and Money - Ernest Mandel 1992

Analyses of bureaucratic power and privilege have an academic pedigree but have also long preoccupied socialists. The collapse of communist rule in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe puts to a new test the classical theories concerning the relationship between bureaucracy and class. *Power and Money* is a timely contribution to this renewal of theory, exploring the social and historical roots of

bureaucracy, both within the capitalist state and in workers' mass organizations. Ernest Mandel draws on archival and contemporary accounts in an analysis of both capitalist administration and the ideology and practice of bureaucratic dictatorship in the communist bloc. He measures the actual performance of western and eastern societies against the forecasts of Lenin and Trotsky, Ludwig von Mises and Roberto Michels, or the more recent reflections of Amitai Etzioni and Alvin Gouldner. This lucid study challenges those theories--Stalinist, Weberian or social-democratic--which claim that an autonomous officialdom is a necessary feature of modern societies. The Greek Girl's Story - Abbé Prévost

With *The Greek Girl's Story*, Alan Singerman presents the first reliable, stand-alone translation and critical edition of Abbé Prévost's 1740 literary masterpiece *Histoire d'une Grecque moderne*. The text of this new English translation is based on Singerman's 1990 French edition, which Jonathan Walsh called "arguably the most valuable critical edition" of Prévost's novel to date. This new edition also includes a complete critical apparatus comprising a substantial introduction, notes, appendixes, and bibliography, all significantly updated from the 1990 French edition, taking into account recent scholarship on this work and providing some additional reflection on the question of Orientalism. Prévost's roman à clef is based on a

true story involving the French ambassador to the Ottoman Porte from 1699 to 1711. It is narrated from the ambassador's viewpoint and is a model of subjective, unreliable narration (long before Henry James). It is remarkably modern in its presentation of an enigmatic, ambiguous character, as the truth about the heroine can never be established with certainty. It is the story of the tormented relationship between the diplomat and a beautiful young Greek concubine, Théophé, whom he frees from a pasha's harem. While her benefactor becomes increasingly infatuated with her and bent on becoming her lover, the Greek girl becomes obsessed with the idea of becoming a virtuous and respected woman. Viewing the ambassador as a father figure, she condemns his quasi-incestuous passion and firmly rejects his repeated seduction attempts. Unable to possess the young woman or tolerate the thought that she might grant to someone else what she has refused him, the narrator subjects her behavior

to minute scrutiny in an effort to catch her in an indiscretion. His investigations are fruitless, however, and Théopé, the victim of incessant persecution, simply dies, leaving all the questions about her behavior unanswered.
