Man mano che Gregorio acquista potere, minacciando persino di rovesciare il Vaticano con un esercito abilmente radunato, il giovane si troverà a dover compiere delle scelte sempre più difficili tra la fedeltà al suo mentore e la gratitudine per l'amicizia di Savelli. Ma Dante non sa che il destino ha qualcosa di molto, molto grande in serbo per lui. Un abate scaltro e spietato. Una nobile famiglia fedele al papa. Tra intrighi e vendette, la difficile ascesa di un giovane nella lotta per il potere. Le atmosfere di *I pilastri della terra* incontrano quelle di *Il nome della rosa* per un grande esordio letterario. Massimo Aureli è appassionato di archeologia e di storia antica fin da ragazzo, ama fare ricerche su

personaggi e luoghi storici meno conosciuti. L'interesse per la scrittura è cresciuto dopo aver lavorato nella biblioteca comunale del paese in cui vive. Mentre approfondiva lo studio di alcune famiglie romane del Medioevo, ha riscoperto la voglia di scrivere e, dopo un anno di lavoro, ha terminato il suo primo romanzo: *I pilastri della cattedrale*.
