Cinema has been long
associated with France, dating
back to 1895, when Louis and
Auguste Lumi_re screened
their works, the first public
viewing of films anywhere.
Early silent pioneers Georges
MZli_s, Alice Guy BlachZ and
others followed in the footsteps

of the Lumi_re brothers and
the tradition of important
filmmaking continued
throughout the 20th century
and beyond. In *Encyclopedia of
French Film Directors*, Philippe
Rège identifies every French
director who has made at least
one feature film since 1895.
From undisputed masters to
obscure one-timers, nearly
3,000 directors are cited here,
including at least 200
filmmakers not mentioned in
similar books published in
France. Each director's entry
contains a brief biographical
summary, including dates and
places of birth and death;
information on the individual's
education and professional
training; and other pertinent
details, such as real names
(when the filmmaker uses a
pseudonym). The entries also
provide complete
filmographies, including credits
for feature films, shorts,
documentaries, and television
work. Some of the most
important names in the history
of film can be found in this
encyclopedia, from masters of
the Golden Age_ Jean Renoir

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and RenZ Clair_to French New Wave artists such as Fran_ois Truffaut and Jean-Luc Godard.

Gypsy Jazz - Michael Dregni 2008-04-04

Of all the styles of jazz to emerge in the twentieth century, none is more passionate, more exhilaratingly up-tempo, or more steeped in an outsider tradition than Gypsy Jazz. And there is no one more qualified to write about Gypsy Jazz than Michael

Dregni, author of the acclaimed biography, Django. A vagabond music, Gypsy Jazz is played today in French Gypsy bars, Romany encampments, on religious pilgrimages--and increasingly on the world's greatest concert stages. Yet its story has never been told, in part because much of its history is undocumented, either in written form or often even in recorded music. Beginning with Django Reinhardt, whose dazzling Gypsy Jazz became the toast of 1930s Paris in the heady days of Josephine Baker, Picasso, and Hemingway, Dregni follows the music as it courses through caravans on the edge of Paris, where today's young French Gypsies learn Gypsy Jazz as a rite of passage, along the Gypsy pilgrimage route to Les Saintes-Maries-de-la-Mer where the Romany play around their campfires, and finally to the new era of international Gypsy stars such as Bireli Lagrene, Boulou Ferre, Dorado Schmitt, and Django's own grandchildren, David Reinhardt and Dallas Baumgartner.

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Interspersed with Dregni's vivid narrative are the words of the musicians themselves, many of whom have never been interviewed for the American press before, as they describe what the music means to them. *Gypsy Jazz* also includes a chapter devoted entirely to American Gypsy musicians who remain largely unknown outside their hidden community. Blending travelogue, detective story, and personal narrative, *Gypsy Jazz* is music history at its best, capturing the history and culture of this elusive music-- and the soul that makes it swing.

French-Speaking Women Documentarians is a guide for teachers of French and others interested in selecting and researching the work of female French-speaking documentarians. Represented in this book are filmmakers from Canada, various African

This guide will lead to the viewing of films that shed understanding on the culture being portrayed and to a greater appreciation of the contribution of French-speaking women filmmakers to this important, if not always objective, film genre.

"The distinctive sound of the
swing-driven guitar style of
Django Reinhardt has become
almost synonymous with a
carefree, bohemian Frenchness
to fans all over the world.
However, we in the US refer to
his music using a telling
designation: Django is known

here as the father of gypsy
jazz. In France, the cultural
significance of the musical
style--called jazz manouche in
reference to his origins in the
Manouche subgroup of
Romanies (known pejoratively
as "Gypsies")--is fraught both
for the Manouche and for the
white French men and women
eager to claim Django as a
native son. In Django
Generations, ethnomusicologist
Siv B. Lie explores the
complicated ways in which
Django's legacy and jazz
manouche express competing
notions of what it means to be
French. Though jazz manouche
is overwhelmingly popular in
France, Manouche people are
more often treated as
outsiders. However, some
Manouche people turn to their
musical heritage to gain
acceptance in mainstream
French society. Considering all
of the characteristics and roles
attributed to Django--as a
world-renowned jazz musician,
as an artistic pioneer, as a
representative of French
heritage, and as a Manouche--
jazz manouche becomes a

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potent means for performers and listeners to articulate their relationships with French society, actual or hoped-for. Weaving together a history of jazz manouche and ethnographic fieldwork undertaken in the bars, festivals, family events, and cultural organizations where jazz manouche is performed and celebrated, Lie offers insight into how a musical genre can channel arguments about national and ethnoracial belonging. She argues that an uncomfortable cohabitation of Manouche identity and French identity lies at the heart of jazz manouche, which is what makes it so successful and powerful"--

The Painted Word - Phil Cousineau 2012-09-11

To untangle the knot of interlocking meanings of these

painted words, logophile and mythologist Phil Cousineau begins each fascinating word entry with his own brief definition. He then fills it in with a tint of etymology and a smattering of quotes that show how the word is used, ending with a list of companion words. The words themselves range from commonplace — like biscuit, a twice-baked cake for Roman soldiers — to loanwords including chaparral, from the Basque shepherds who came to the American West; words from myths, such as hector; metamorphosis words, like silly, which evolved holy to goofy in a mere thousand years; and words well worthy of revival, such as carrytale, a wandering storyteller. Whether old-fangled or brand new, all the words included in *The Painted Word* possess an ineffable quality that makes them luminous.

Within a theoretical framework and drawing on primary sources, this study considers the historical, theoretical, and concrete aspects of this practice through the study of the translations of authors such as Robertson Davies, Carol Shields, Margaret Atwood, Michael Ondaatje, Ann-Marie MacDonald, and Alistair MacLeod. The book also includes a comprehensive bibliography of English-language novels, poetry, and plays published and translated in France over the past 240 years.
