Peter Lombard - Philipp W. Rosemann 2004-04-01

The Book of Sentences is essentially a compilation of older sources, from the Scriptures and Augustine down to several of the Lombard's contemporaries, such as Hugh of Saint Victor and Peter Abelard. Turning to the Sentences, Rosemann then offers a brief exposition of the Lombard's life and work. He proceeds to a bookby-book examination and interpretation of its main topics, including the nature and attributes of God, the Trinity, creation, angelology, human nature and the Fall, original sin, Christology, ethics, and the sacraments. He concludes by

exploring how the Sentences helped shape the further development of the Christian tradition, from the twelfth century through the time of Martin Luther.
